Deborah paved the way with encouraging words. (Judges 4–5)

The name Deborah means "bee." She served as judge under a palm tree that became known as "the palm of Deborah."

*The NIV Study Bible* says: "The Hebrew word for 'honey' refers to both bees' honey and the sweet syrupy juice of dates.

Deborah, the Bee, dispensed the sweetness of justice as she held court, not in a city gate where male judges sat, but under the shade of a 'honey' tree."\*

## The Promise of Power

The root word means "to endeavor to accomplish something; fight, labor fervently, strive." For example, to compete for a prize or to contend with an adversary.

Paul asked believers to struggle with him in prayer. (Ephesians 6:19-20)
